The Chillagoe Caving Club was formed in Chillagoe at an inaugural meeting on 23rd April, 1973 with 16 persons present. The intention of forming the Club was to bring together the active cavers already in the area to enable them to share their knowledge, expertise and equipment, and to foster caving as a sport and a science, particularly in the Chillagoe area.

The Club became an Associate of the Australian Speleological Federation not long after the Club was formed and voted to become a Corporate Member at the Annual Meeting in 1995. The Club was incorporated under the Queensland Associations Incorporation Act of 1981.

Full Membership of the Club stands at 48 with an additional 18 Novice 'Introductory' Members as at the end of March, 2018. The Club has become well recognized by Australian and overseas cavers and scientists as an invaluable contact in relation to Chillagoe and the surrounding areas.

The Club has an established Clubhouse in Chillagoe for the accommodation of members caving in the area.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2019-20

As the Club turns 47 years old it is becoming time to think about what we are going to do for the 50th Anniversary in 2023. It's a major milestone for us and we should reflect on the achievements and knowledge that we have gained as a club, and as cavers. We are also very blessed to still have some original founding members amongst us who are still actively caving. I would like to propose that we set up a committee to look at our options – be it a local event, expedition, or project – to not only celebrate but also to launch the Club into its next 50 years.

Time to report on what has happened in the last 12 months:-

- We were able to use the grant obtained in 2018 to do some major renovations and works to the Clubhouse. It has now been completely re-roofed, stairs have been fixed, gutters were redone, and the exterior was painted. It has given the Clubhouse a new lease of life for the foreseeable future. Some tasks remain to be done – in particular the painting of the interior upstairs.
- We have purchased and installed a new bore pump for the Clubhouse property. This replaces the old pump which failed several years ago. It is more powerful than the old pump and should hopefully allow our caretaker to keep the place much greener than it has been!
- New caretaker and groundsman agreements have been finalized with Clare and Alan respectively. These outline roles and responsibilities and are to be reviewed every year at our AGM. This year that process will be delayed slightly until Covid-19 restrictions ease.
- Speaking of Covid-19... it was apparent to the management committee that action needed to be taken in relation to visiting our Clubhouse. This was particularly the case as our Caretakers are elderly and in a high-risk group should they contract the virus. A policy was developed and distributed to the membership. For the sake of posterity, I have included it in this annual report
- Also due to Covid-19 we have seen demand for our facilities drop off significantly. TAS has cancelled a number of school camps which bring in money for the Club. This has to a small degree been offset by the Army personnel who were staying at the old schoolhouse for several weeks recently. Hopefully, the situation will ease, and our income stream will increase again.
- In terms of caving I know that our activities were reduced this year, particularly in 2020. A revised club weekend schedule is going to be developed and released and I would encourage everyone to make time to go caving and use the Club facilities when covid-19 restrictions are eased.
- I would like to thank Paul Osborne who attended the ASF Conference meetings in Sydney for us earlier this year. Paul ably represented us and put forth practical and sound advice in relation to several issues including new admin procedures, membership changes and a new child safety policy. Paul's travel costs were partially met by the Club, but I thank him for his time and the extra effort required.
- The advent of the pandemic has also highlighted the ease with which online meetings can be held. We will be progressing our efforts in that area for the coming year and having committee meetings in that fashion more regularly. Hopefully we can expand that to perhaps have general Club meetings as well.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone who has contributed to our Club this year. That includes helping with tree removal, maintenance, taking people caving, donating time and money and all the other little things that never get a mention. Without everyone's contribution we would not have a functioning Club. Thank you one and all.

TREASURERS REPORT 2019-20

Club finances are still stable overall. The end of year balance appears much lower than last year but this is because last year's amount was boosted by the \$10,000 donation. This year we are pretty much back to normal. The end of year bank balance is looking very healthy however we still need to use some money to finish internal painting of the caretaker residence (upstairs of the clubhouse). The grant money has been spent on repairing the roof, which was some really essential maintenance to ensure the longevity of the building.

The old Bendigo Bank account has finally been consolidated into the Commonwealth account, which makes the bookkeeping just that little bit easier. Each year the process is streamlined a bit further. My goal for the coming year is to write down the procedures for the Treasurer, to remove inefficiencies as much as possible and make the role more transparent, so all the knowledge doesn't sit with one person.

This year the grant money has pushed our income over the limit of \$20,000 which means our club requires the finances to be audited. I feel much more confident about this now than I did when I took on the role of treasurer two years ago, and trust that everything will be in order.

The number of people camping at the clubhouse was down but camping income was steady due to the co-caretaker, Alan, paying camping fees to the club. Membership income has been lower and there have been fewer intro cavers than in previous years if only because there have not been so many club weekends and opportunities to bring beginners caving. The club needs to work on building a solid group of active cavers. The committee had agreed to streamline club weekends this year, and I had grand plans of advertising them better via email to attract more members along, but COVID-19 restrictions have caused caving to be postponed for the time being.

Our club, like many others, now faces a period of uncertainty, as nobody knows how long current restrictions will last and when we can all go caving again. It is good to enter this time with some money in the bank at least!

- While it is intended that all active members join ASF some existing members, who are no longer active cavers, are continuing as Club Members only.

Please note: a major component of the ASF fees is insurance which needs to be paid by all active members of the club, especially those intending to cave in National Park area's and Reserves.

Use of Clubhouse and Club Assets Policy (Clubhouse Protocol)

1. Members have access to the Club area on the ground floor of Clubhouse building. The upstairs back residence, together with the garage and laundry area on the town side of the Club area and the adjacent yard area, are for the private use of the Caretaker.
2. The Caretaker has a lease on her part of the property and the Club has only the limited access allowed under the Residential Tenancies Act. Therefore, Members should contact the Caretaker upon arrival and before departure, but otherwise, enter the private area only on the invitation of the Caretaker.
3. Members, when intending to stay at the Clubhouse, should have the courtesy to telephone the Caretaker to advise her in advance. If the Caretaker is absent, a suitable message should be left on her telephone message bank.
4. Members, when in Chillagoe, may use the Clubhouse facilities, even if not staying at the Clubhouse. However, it is courtesy to tell the Caretaker before using the facilities.
5. Mutual courtesy between Members (and their guests) and the Caretaker is to be expected at all times.
6. Responsibilities of Caretaker are to:
 - (a) Maintain grounds in tidy and safe condition and do any minor maintenance to buildings etc.
 - (b) Keep Clubhouse clean when not in use by Members
 - (c) Maintain supply of toilet paper, cleaning supplies and cleaning equipment for use by Members
 - (d) Keep refrigerator and freezer ready for use by Members
 - (e) Ensure security is maintained for lights, tackle and other Club property
 - (f) Ensure trip book is accessible and, as much as practical, monitor trip book, particularly for the safe return of caving parties.
 - (g) Collect Camping and Tackle fees on behalf of Treasurer
 - (h) Report to Club Executive any problems he encounters with Clubhouse, Members or guests
7. Responsibilities of Members are to:
 - (a) Keep Clubhouse and the outdoor toilet and shower block clean and tidy, while in residence. Cleanliness should be checked to be satisfactory before leaving.
 - (b) Park cars in an orderly fashion at the allocated parking area and keep vehicle speed down to walking pace to minimize hazard and dust.
 - (d) Report to Caretaker any deficiencies in cleaning supplies, equipment etc.
 - (e) Use trip book if caving
 - (f) Dispose of food scraps in compost bin at the back of the clubhouse and take all rubbish with you when leaving
 - (g) Camping inside the Clubhouse should be avoided except in emergencies (i.e. if drenched in heavy storm).
 - (h) If using Clubhouse at night, keep noise down, particularly after 10pm.**
 - (i) Behave in the town and at the Clubhouse in such a way that the Club's reputation is enhanced and not diminished.
 - (j) Report to Executive any problems encountered in using the Clubhouse and make suggestions where improvements are needed.
 - (k) Pay camping fees ASAP on leaving with the caretaker or by direct deposit to the club bank account.

8. Use of Club facilities and equipment by non-club entities and groups.

- a) The use of club facilities by non-club entities and groups will be by formal arrangement between the entity and the Management Committee. Fees and costs for the services requested will be set by the Management Committee and will not be lower than those charged to regular members.
- b) The hire of Club equipment and tackle such as helmets will be by express written arrangement with the management committee. The entity or person will provide a written guarantee to replace damaged or lost equipment and a copy of insurance naming the CHILLAGOE CAVING CLUB as a third party covered for the use of such equipment.
- c) Ropes, Ladders and SRT equipment will not be hired/used by non-ASF persons or entities under any circumstances. (AGM 2017)

9. Responsibilities of groups.

- (a) Make formal booking with MC at info@chillagoecavingclub.org.au
- (b) Confirm booking two weeks prior with Caretaker. (Ph No on website)
- (c) Use is restricted to the main ablutions block, rear camping area and old school building. School groups will have exclusive use of these areas.
- (d) Use of the main clubhouse and kitchen may be available if not being used by club members.
- (e) Remove all rubbish at the end of stay.
- (f) Clean the facilities to the same standard as arrival.
- (g) Provide number details to Treasurer ASAP for invoicing, pay in advance or on invoice using direct banking.

10. Dogs are allowed only with the express permission of the caretaker, must be tied up at all times away from the major use areas (clubhouse and amenities blocks) and not left alone during the day.

2020 Covid-19 Clubhouse policy

The Chillagoe Caving Club is now required to have a policy to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic as it relates to our facilities and caving generally. The following has been decided as a community safety focused approach:-

- 1. All Club members are to minimize their travel to Chillagoe and their use of the Clubhouse facilities. Caving and use of Club facilities should only be undertaken if there is a good reason for doing so. Recreational caving is not considered a good reason at this time.
- 2. If you do need to use Clubhouse facilities then the following will strictly apply:-
 - a. You MUST contact the Clubhouse Warden (Paul Osborne) prior to heading to Chillagoe.
 - b. No more than six people will be permitted at the Club grounds in Chillagoe at any one time (excluding the caretakers).

- c. You must either camp or use the Schoolhouse building for accommodation;
- d. You are not to enter the Caretaker part of the Club grounds;
- e. Access to the bottom section of the Clubhouse is strictly limited to use of the tackle room. If this is required then Clare has a key and you must disinfect whatever you touch.
- f. Use of fridges and freezers is limited to the fridge in the BBQ shed and the freezer under the old schoolhouse. Use them ONLY IF ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY. Bring your own fridge if you can.
- g. The kitchen is not to be used to cook and the rest of the Clubhouse is not to be used to socialise. You must bring your own stove/cooking facilities to be used at the schoolhouse or in the camping grounds.
- h. You must use the amenities block and bring your own toilet paper. The toilet in the Clubhouse is not to be used by members.
- i. You must take all rubbish with you when you leave and dispose of it yourself.
- j. If the Clubhouse is accessed then users must disinfect the areas they have been in, each and every time (e.g. door knobs and handles, benches, etc).

Once again please consider why you are travelling to Chillagoe and what your reasons are. Consider the effects on others – the potential for spreading COVID-19 and the consequences of having an accident etc while driving or caving. Do you really need to potentially burden our hospitals or services if you were to get hurt.... Please stay at home if at all possible and stay healthy and safe.
